Auction Update

Thank you for another successful auction! This year's auction profited \$205,000. There was \$122,000 raised for tuition assistance this year. There was also \$83,000 raised for the general fund through the special wish list ask, and it was matched with \$105,000 in gifts from a number of generous donors. Therefore, the total funds raised through the auction this year comes to \$310,000. In the last fourteen years, money raised for tuition assistance through the auction has helped approximately 1,000 students/families. What a blessing! Again, thank you to all who attended, donated, and worked tirelessly to make this auction a great success!

Serving on the Auction Steering Committee is a three year commitment: one year for training, one year to serve in the volunteer position, and one year to train a new volunteer. It is a very meaningful way to serve, especially knowing that students at Trinity will be blessed by your efforts and the tuition assistance that has been provided. It's also a lot of fun.
